La Conférence AIDS Impact est le principal événement international spécifiquement dédié aux sciences humaines et sociales dans le secteur de l'épidémie VIH.

La dernière conférence à Cape Town en Afrique du Sud a réuni plus de 700 participants du monde entier. Cette opportunité a permis de valoriser la recherche en sciences sociales sur l'épidémie du VIH dans les pays en voie de développement.

La première Conférence AIDS Impact date de l'année 1991 à Amsterdam aux Pays-Bas. Depuis, AIDS Impact est organisée tous les 2 ans.

En 2007, Marseille et sa Région sont fières d'accueillir la 8^{ème} Conférence AIDS Impact. Ce congrès est organisé par l'INSERM-Unité de Recherche 379 et l'Institut Fédératif de Recherches SHESS-AM (IFR 134 « Sciences Humaines, Economiques et Sociales appliquées à la Santé » à Aix-Marseille).

AIDS Impact 2007 propose la création d'un réseau de collaboration entre les aspects médicaux, psychologiques et sociaux du VIH, tout en offrant une plateforme où chercheurs, médecins et patients pourront dialoguer et débattre.

The AIDS Impact Conference is the most important international event specifically devoted to Human and Social Sciences in the field of the HIV epidemic.

The last conference was held in 2005 in Cape Town, South Africa, and brought together more than 700 participants from all over the world. It was also an unique opportunity to give more space to research in social sciences dealing with the HIV epidemic in developing countries.

The first AIDS Impact Conference goes back to the year 1991 when it was organised in Amsterdam, Netherlands. Ever since, AIDS Impact has taken place every other year.

In 2007, the city of Marseilles, France, is proud to be the host of the 8th AIDS Impact Conference. The conference is co-organised by the INSERM Research Unit 379 and the Federative Research Institute SHESS-AM (IFR 134 - "Human, Economic & Social Sciences" applied to Health in Aix-Marseilles).

The focus of AIDS Impact 2007 is on the creation of a network between the biological, psychological and social aspects of HIV by offering a platform where researchers, practitioners and users can engage in dialogue and debate.

In 2007, there will also be a series of events and activities organised outside the conference by local Non Governmental Organisations so as to involve the general public as much as possible.






